Greetings!

PowerPoint is great at allowing a user to animate complex presentations. The downside is that animating can be time consuming. Learning the ins and outs of the Selection Pane can save you time and help you to have more elegant animations.

The Selection Pane allows the user to rename and rearrange the order of objects presented on our slide which is especially useful on slides with many objects.

To preview the Selection Pane:

1. Click on the Home tab
2. Under Select, scroll down and choose Selection Pane

The Selection Pane will display the list of elements found on the slide. Double click an element on the list to rename it. Clicking the Eye icon on the right of each element hides it. Combined elements are also identified on the Selection Pane as they appear under the same group and can be controlled either together or individually. Identifying elements is important if you want to quickly replace graphics or delete elements on your slide.

Add Sizzle to Your Slides!

Motion Paths creates smooth movement of objects on the slide. You can create the entrance of an element from a precise point and have it settle at another specific location. When used effectively, Motion Paths create elegant video-like movements that add a new dimension to (sometimes) very static presentations.
